Sunday, July 28 Why We Need More Strong Clinical Trials of Laboratory Tests

Patrick M. Bossuyt, PhD Full Professor, Clinical Epidemiology Amsterdam UMC University of Amsterdam Amsterdam, The Netherlands

Clinical trials representing groups sampled from the intended use population are an essential step for properly evaluating new pharmaceuticals and other interventions in clinical medicine, such as surgical strategies. In contrast, laboratory medicine has not experienced serious pressure to provide evidence of clinical performance, or clinical utility, of laboratory tests based on clinical trials.
